"Mahlon Layne was my grandmother's brother. She (Class of 1899) and I (Class of 1967) attended Dakota Wesleyan University in Mitchell, SD. The school's library was assisted by the Layne Foundation in the mid 1950's after a fire burned the school library. A new library was opened in 1958 called "The Layne Library," which is possibly going to lose its identity with the opening of a new library." ~Layne Bumgardner

Howard and I had never heard of him, so I sent an e-mail out asking if anyone knew anything about him. The answer came from Emanuel Swartz. ~Marge

"Honorable Friend Marge Marshall: Just a quickie on your discovery of the mysterious usurper. I met Dave Berg and his Momma in Santa Ana in 1944. They were involved with some type of evangelistic crusade. Bernice Linger was well-acquainted with them. I was the one who introduced Bernice to Larry Hudlow. And then they were married. Dave Berg and Momma were an odd couple. They had nothing to do with the formation of the Hospitality Home. That was strictly an enterprise by Mr. Layne, a wealthy oil man, who designed the Layne Pump. Mrs. Layne was the guiding light behind the Hospitality Home operation. The original crew members were Irwin and Bertha, Jennie Hafley, Mrs. Smith, and Larry Hudlow."

Pat Vickers Stokes recognized David Berg as the founder of a cult known as "The Children of God," also known as "The Family." Emanuel was right in calling Berg "the usurper"! "Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world." (See I John 3:1-3)

"Thank you for sending me a copy of *The Home News* - I enjoyed every word in the paper. I opened the envelope and read everything before I put it back in. I joined the US Navy in Jan. 1941; was discharged 12/10/46. Received Jesus Christ as my Saviour in Dec. 1941 aboard the old USS Enterprise Aircraft Carrier. Transferred to North Island in Sept. 1943. My title was AOM 1°. Spent time at Mother Layne's Hospitality Home from Sept. 1943 through 1945. Married Grace Aug 6, 1945. We have 6 girls, four boys, 17 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren (as of Dec. 2003). Pastored several churches from '55 to '75. Come see us when you get to California!" ~Ernest Owen

$\begin{array}{ccc} C~H~O~W & D~O~W~N~! \\ \textbf{Tacos by Virginia Gonzalez Hayden} \end{array}$

1 to 2 lbs ground beef Garlic to taste, chopped A pinch of oregano A pinch of cumin Salt & black pepper to taste Corn tortillas Cooking oil

For garnishes: chopped onion; chopped tomatoes; cheddar cheese; lettuce; olives; taco sauce.

Brown the meat with the chopped garlic, until no pink shows. Stir in oregano, cumin, salt and pepper. Set aside while tortillas are crisped.

In oil, crisp the tortillas, folding each one in half when it has softened, then continue to crisp. Fill the tortillas with the meat mixture and top with your favorite garnishes.

Ron Alsop lives in Tustin CA; that made me think of those blimps I used to admire in 1954 while Howard was attending Southern California Bible College in Costa Mesa (now Vanguard University). Here's Ron's reply to my question. "No more blimps at the now closed USMC helicopter base in Tustin. The base has been closed for about 6 years and is going through a major redevelopment for housing, schools, shopping, light industry and parks. They will keep one blimp hanger designated a historical site. They also closed the El Toro base - about 8 years ago. It's to be turned into a major Orange County park. Some of us wish they would have turned it into another civilian airport to help the anticipated overcrowding at John Wayne Airport in Costa Mesa." Ron is a pilot, SEL, commercial licensed.

Lloyd & Leona (Galloway) Dailey live in Lakeside, CA. Lloyd is a retired San Diego firefighter, as well as a retired pastor. The Daileys' two sons, Tom and Charles, have built homes near Lloyd and Leona, and Grandfather and Grandmother enjoy having their whole family nearby.

The Daileys celebrated 50 years of marriage in 2004. Howard & Marge Marshall remember their wedding day at the Hospitality Home very well because our first child, Larry, was born the next day – quite probably because Marge went down and up the stairs again and again. Some of the guys tried to kidnap the groom and some of the other guys tried to stop it – it ended well, and the bride and groom have lived happily ever after!

Larry was born on June 20, 1954, which was Father's Day. He certainly wasn't the only baby born at Balboa Naval Hospital that day. The Korean "War" had just ended, so there was a small "baby boom" happening!

The timing of our baby's birth was a blessing from the Lord. During the initial six months of pregnancy, a woman had to seek non-Navy care because of the numbers of women involved. My due date was June 25th and when it was time to see the Navy doctor, we knew that Howard would receive his discharge two months early, effective on that very day. The doctor warned us that if I was hospitalized then, the daily rate would go from \$1.25 a day to \$16.00 a day. If the baby came after that date, I would not even be admitted. So the doctor advised us to return to the civilian doctor, instead of beginning Navy care. We decided to just trust the Lord and stay with the less expensive choice. (I think we were living on less than \$200.00 a month.) The Lord worked it out beautifully: Larry was born June 20th and we left the hospital before noon on June 25th, for a grand total of \$7.50. Remember those days, ladies, when you stayed in the hospital that long? How times have changed! Today mom and baby go home on day two.
